THE COLLEGE

The College was founded by Model Town Society in 1970 and started in the building of Model Town School. After the school was nationalized in 1972, the college was shifted to a rented building.

On demand of the residents of Model Town and the college administration to have proper building for the higher education institution, the Government of the Punjab reserved a piece of land measuring over 55 Kanals for Government Model College in Model Town Extension Scheme, M-Block, Lahore. The government constructed the building of the college in 1986. This double story building comprised class rooms, science laboratories, library, administration block and play grounds.

In November 1995, Education Department, Government of the Punjab, in recognition of the services rendered by Govt College Model Town in the field of education and considering the needs of the area, upgraded the college from Intermediate to Degree. The Government also granted permission to start computer classes at Intermediate and Degree level.

In 2005, a beautiful, spacious 3-storey new building was constructed which comprises 16 rooms, 4 laboratories, conference room and offices for senior faculty. Some new buildings and more expansion plans are on the cards in the near future. During the last seven years, the college has achieved outstanding results and positions in the academic and co-curricular fields. It has turned out to be a much disciplined institution.



In 2020, three BS programs (Mathematics, English, BBA) in affiliation with University of the Punjab, Lahore were launched as a token of recognition for the input given by the faculty and the college administration. Hence in 2021, the college was renamed as Govt. Graduate College, Model Town, Lahore.

The College Counselling Centre

The College Counselling Centre was established in 2020 to help students resolve their problems in terms of health, finances, academics and career choices. It enables the students to identify their strengths and talents and to harness their potential in the right direction. ADMISSION RULES

Students are admitted after having passed the Matriculation and, as the case may be, the Intermediate Examination. In this connection the rules of the Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, Lahore/University of the Punjab and Govt. of the Punjab are observed. Candidates who have passed the Senior Cambridge / O' Level Examination are admitted in the first year class; they are required to apply for admission on the prescribed form together with academic certificates and a satisfactory character certificate from the institution last attended on their successful completion of Senior Cambridge / O' Level Examination. They are also directed to submit the equivalence certificate issued by IBCC, Islamabad.

The dates for admission to first and third year classes are advertised in the leading newspapers after the declaration of the result of examinations conducted by the Board/University. Applications for admission on the prescribed forms are accepted within due dates after verification from the gazette notification

Important Instructions for Candidates

The Students must take into account the following instructions:

- * Candidates must submit the admission form provided by the college; photocopies of the admission form will not be accepted.
- * A candidate applying for more than one faculty/ category must submit separate admission form for each case.
- * A candidate will not be permitted to change the group or to take back the admission form after submission.

- * Selected candidates will lose their right of admission if they fail to deposit the fee and other dues within the given dates, so it is in their own interest that they must remain in touch with the college for further instructions.
- * Fee will be deposited in the bank. Fee, once deposited, will not be returned.
- * Hafiz-e-Quran will be given 20 marks with the condition that he must qualify the Hifz-e-Quran test and should produce Hifz-e-Quran Certificate from a registered institution. Such candidate must clearly write down category at the top of the admission form.
- * It is mandatory for the candidates to appear for the interview. Absent students will lose their right of admission. All original certificates/degrees must be produced at the time of interview.
- * It is the discretion of the Principal that he can cancel the admission of any candidate without assigning any reason.

Admission on Reserved and Disability Basis

Those who are desirous of seeking admission against the disabled seats need to submit the application along with regular form. Otherwise their application will not be entertained. 2% seats are reserved for physically disabled candidates, 2% seats are reserved for sports (Only for 1st Year Arts Students) & 2% reserved for Minorities according to the Government



policy. They are required to enclose the certificate of disability issued by the Medical Superintendent, Services Hospital Lahore or by the Director General Health Services Punjab or Center for the Rehabilitation of the Disabled, Ferozpur Road, Lahore.

They will have to appear before the committee for interview on the notified date, failing which they will lose their right for admission.

Interview and admission schedule with dates for reserved seats will be displayed on the college notice boards. Candidates must keep in touch with college.

CHANGE OF SUBJECTS

At the time of admission, subjects should be selected carefully; change in subjects will be allowed only in special cases before the board and university registration.

Important Instructions for students

- ❖ The names of the students remaining absent for 10 days a month will be struck off from the college rolls.
- ❖ Struck off list will be pasted at the Notice Board on 10th of each month.
- ❖ Re-admission will be allowed once in each session after receiving Rs. 150/- as fee/fine.
- ❖ Eligible students will be readmitted from 10th to 12th of each month.
- ❖ The list of readmitted students will be pasted at Notice Board on 15th of each month.

LEAVE RULES

- ❖ I.C.S. /F.A/ F.Sc. / I.Com: Teachers of the subjects of Urdu and English will sanction leave for 1 to 3 days.
- ❖ Sick Leave: Subject to the provision of medical certificate from a Govt. hospital.
- ❖ Marriage Leave: The students must attach Invitation Card when applying for leave.
- ❖ Leave for Other Reasons: Every type of leave application must reach the College Office in time. Post dated leave will not be acceptable.

Note: Leave for more than 3 days will be sanctioned by the Vice-Principal for all classes.

HIFZ-E-QURAN ASSESSMENT

The candidates claiming credit for being Hafiz-e-Quran shall be considered only after presentation of the original certificate and verification and the recommendation by the Quran Assessment Committee.

ATTENDANCE RULES

If a student of Intermediate fails to attend 75% lectures in any subject, his admission form will not be sent to the Lahore Board. Leave on medical or any other ground whatsoever will not be counted towards attendance. A prior permission for grant of leave from the competent authority should be obtained on the prescribed leave application form which can be obtained from the Chemistry Lab.

MIGRATION POLICY

The college accepts a limited number of students for migration, provided the students fall on merit and the seats are available in the respective discipline. The student must present a statement of his conduct, attendance and marks in class tests from his previous institute. Migration is strictly allowed according to the Board and University rules.

FEE CONCESSION

1. According to the Government rules and regulations, fee concession is granted to the deserving students from the available resources.
2. Fee concession is granted to a student having good character, satisfactory educational performance and regular attendance.
3. If a student who is availing himself of fee concession fails in any paper of any examination, the concession or stipend will be withdrawn.
4. Applications for fee concession are received after the instructions from the college are issued.
5. Application will not be received after the due date and no excuse will be accepted in this regard.

SCHOLARSHIPS & STIPENDS

The deserving and the poor students are given financial assistance out of College Fund. They should submit application to the Incharge Scholarships/Fee Concession.

DUTIES OF STUDENTS

Students must maintain discipline in the college, classrooms, laboratories, playing fields and at the congregations.

Students should not damage the college property. They should not shift the furniture from the classrooms.

Students should not use obscene language and avoid quarrels.

Students must avoid roaming and making a noise in the corridors during the classes or examination.

Students are not allowed to enter the college office and staff room without permission.

Entry of cars, motorcycles and bicycles etc. in the academic area during the college hours is prohibited. The students should park their vehicles at the parking place only.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in the college premises. Use of mobile phone on the college campus is strictly prohibited.

No student without college card/uniform is allowed to attend the College.

No student is allowed to keep arms and ammunition (even licensed) on the college campus.

The college administration can ban the entry of any student in the college on disciplinary grounds for a specified period.

Instructions For Parents/guardians

- ❖ Parents/Guardians must keep in touch with the teachers and the Principal of the college for the physical, mental, moral and educational betterment of their children.
- ❖ For any problem faced by students, the parents/guardians should immediately contact the Principal/Vice-Principal or the concerned Incharge.
- ❖ Parents/Guardians must keep their children away from politics.
- ❖ Parents/Guardians must make their children realize to observe discipline/rules of college.
- ❖ The parents must make students strictly follow the rules and regulations of the college.

Fines on Disciplinary Violations

Special fines are imposed on the students for the reasons given below. The amount of the fine and penalty will be the discretion of the college administration.

- ❖ For not wearing prescribed uniform. Rs. 100/-per day.
- ❖ For not displaying the college card on the chest pocket. Rs.50
- ❖ For violating the college discipline minimum Rs. 100/-, maximum Rs. 1000/-
- ❖ For remaining absent in each paper, Rs. 100/-
- ❖ For remaining absent in class despite being present in college Rs. 5/-per period, Rs. 10/- full day.
- ❖ For using android mobile phone/camera, Rs. 1000/-

COLLEGE CARD

All students must carry their college cards while on campus, failing which they can be penalized. It is mandatory for a student to display the college card on the chest pocket.

DAY OFFICERS

Appointed Officers of the day from the teaching staff remain on duty daily from morning till the end of the college classes. They check the uniform of the students and maintain general discipline in the college. The Day Officers on duty attest the documents of the students. They submit a daily report to the Principal.

PROCTORIAL BOARD

College Proctorial Board, consisting of a panel of teachers and headed by the Chief Proctor (Prof. Munir Afzal Butt), is responsible for maintaining discipline in the college. The Proctorial Board also assists the college administration in the smooth running of college affairs.

TIME TABLE

Prof. Masood Rafiq (Statistics Department) is the Incharge of College Time Table; the students can contact him in case of any problem relating to the College Time Table.

DISPENSARY

The college has a dispensary, which is run under the supervision of Dr. Muhammad Saqib Shahzad (Biology Department). The dispensary provides services to the students during the college hours. The dispensary has a stock of essential medicines, which are provided to the students in case of any emergency

BOOK BANK

A book bank has been set up under the supervision of Prof. Muddassar Shakeel in the college through which the poor and deserving students are provided text books. The professors and students of the college run this book bank. The students who complete their studies voluntarily donate the used text books so that the deserving students may use them.

PARKING

A parking lot has been reserved in the College. The students and their visitors may park their bicycles, motorcycles at their own risk during the college hours. Students are directed to lock their vehicles after parking in the stand. They must obtain the parking token. In case the token is lost, the student/visitor would be expected to submit a copy of his CNIC along with witness of two guarantors from College and payment of Rs. 50/- as fine.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

A student is issued one book for two weeks and if the need arises the book can be reissued. If the book is overdue, the student is fined Rs.1-daily & if the book is misplaced or lost, a new book or triple price of the book is received. The students are also provided with internet facilities. The following books are not issued to the students.

Students are issued library cards after the admission. A duplicate library card will be issued after payment of Rs. 50/-. The book issued on the lost card will be the responsibility of the student in whose name the book was issued.
